DESIGN INFORMATION

The Enoree Kerchief is an easy square shawl worked from corner to corner garter stitch for a rhythmic and soothing project. Stitches are picked up around the perimeter of the shawl to work the sweet lace edging.

SKILL LEVEL



FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

27" by 27" square

YARN

mYak Baby Yak Lace - Lace weight; 100% baby yak wool; 380 yards (350 meters) / 50 g (1.75 oz), 2 skeins, photographed in Canyon
Or ~475 yards of lace weight yarn.

GAUGE

20 sts and 20 rows = 4" over garter stitch, blocked

NEEDLES

US 3 / 3.25 mm 32" circular needles, or size to obtain gauge.

Note: Circular needles are used to accommodate the number of stitches for the body and for the lace edging. The shawl body is worked back & forth in rows.

TOOLS

Tapestry needle, blocking wires, blocking pins.



SCHEMATIC

Note: Schematic is approximate as the final size depends on how aggressively you block your shawl.

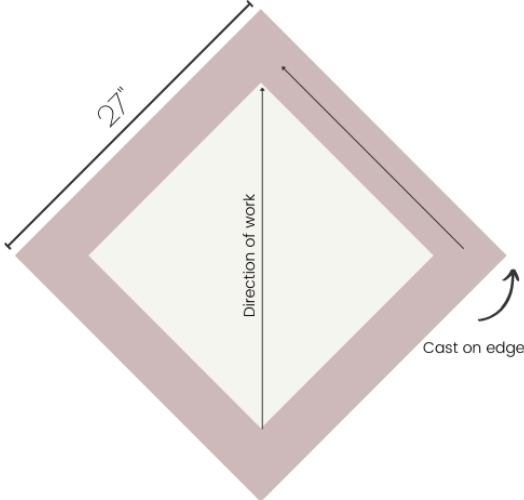
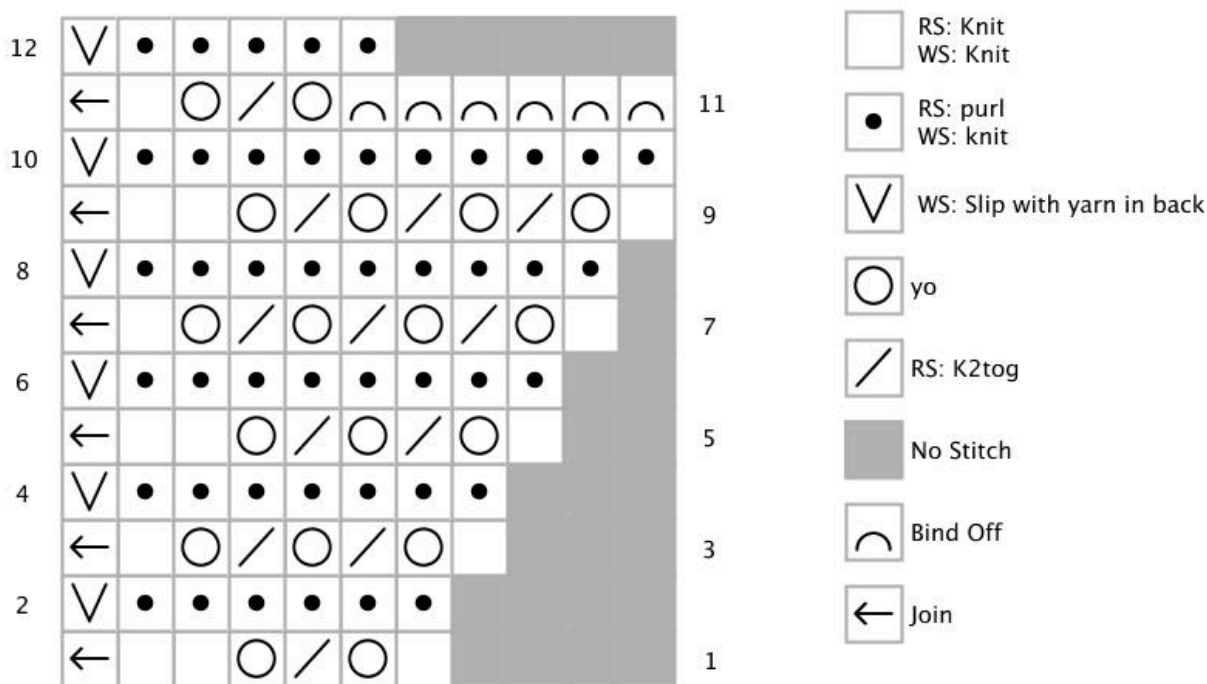


CHART INSTRUCTIONS

Note: Every RS row ends with a join: this is a k2tog, worked over 1 st from the edging, and 1 st from the shawl body.



WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS

ENOREE LACE EDGING

Row 1 (RS): K1, yo, k2tog, yo, k2, join

Row 2 (WS): Sl1 wyib, knit to end

Row 3: K1, (yo, k2tog) x2, yo, k1, join

Row 4: Sl1 wyib, knit to end

Row 5: K1, (yo, k2tog) x2, yo, k2, join

Row 6: Sl1 wyib, knit to end

Row 7: K1, (yo, k2tog) x3, yo, k1, join

Row 8: Sl1 wyib, knit to end

Row 9: K1, (yo, k2tog) x3, yo, k2, join

Row 10: Sl1 wyib, knit to end

Row 11: BO 6, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, join

Row 12: Sl1 wyib, knit to end

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PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

SHAWL BODY

Cast on 3 sts.

BEGINNING INCREASE SECTION

Row 1 (RS): Knit

Row 2 (WS): K1, m1, k1, m1, k1 - 5 sts

Row 3: K2, m1, k1, m1, k2 - 7 sts

Row 4: Knit

Row 5: K3, m1, k1, m1, k3 - 9 sts

Row 6: Knit

MAIN INCREASE SECTION

Row 1 (RS): K3, m1, knit to last 3 sts, m1, k3 - 2 sts inc'd

Row 2 (WS): Knit

Rep rows 1 & 2 29 times more, ending with Row 2 - 69 sts

MAIN DECREASE SECTION

Row 1 (RS): K3, ssk, knit to last 5 sts, k2tog, k3 - 2 sts dec'd

Row 2 (WS): Knit

Rep rows 1 & 2 28 times more, ending with Row 2 - 11 sts

ENDING DECREASE SECTION

Row 1 (RS): K3, ssk, k1, k2tog, K3 - 9 sts

Row 2: Knit

Row 3: K2, ssk, k1, k2tog, k2 - 7 sts

Row 4: Knit

Row 5: K1, ssk, k1, ktog, k1 - 5 sts

Row 6: Knit

Row 7: K1, sk2p, k1 - 3 sts

BO all sts loosely, do not cut yarn.



LACE EDGING

PICK UP INSTRUCTIONS

With RS facing, *rotate shawl 90 degrees, and pick up 33 sts along the side edge of the shawl body, place marker; rep from * three times more, place BOR marker - 132 sts.

Note: You are picking up stitches, not picking up and knitting stitches. In order to do this, you'll need to insert your circular needle as if to knit, without pulling up the working yarn. This keeps your working yarn in the right placement for the lace edging.

ENOREE LACE EDGING

Without turning your work, and using the backward loop cast on method, cast on 6 sts to your left hand needle. (LHN). These will be the stitches used to work your knit-on edging.

Note: The first time you work Row 1 of the Lace Edging, work as k1, yo, k2tog, yo, k2, join. You can't slip the first stitch since it's a cast on stitch.

Work rows 1 – 12 of the Enoree Lace Edging a total of 22 times. On every RS row, the last join stitch is a k2tog, worked over 1 st from the edging, and 1 st from the shawl body.

After final repeat of Edging, 6 sts remain.

BO all sts loosely, cut yarn leaving a long tail.

Using a tapestry needle, graft your bound off sts to the beginning of edging.

FINISHING

BLOCKING

Wet block finished garment according to schematic and let fabric dry completely before unpinning. Weave in all ends.



ABBREVIATIONS

BO - bind off

BOR - beginning of round

k - Knit

k2tog - knit two stitches together

LHN - left hand needle

p - Purl

pm - place marker

RHN - right hand needle

rnd - round

RS - right side

sk2p - slip 1 stitch as if to knit, k2tog, pass slipped stitch over

sl - slip st

sm - slip marker

ssk - slip 2 stitches individually as if to knit, return these two stitches to the left hand needle and knit them together through the back loops

WS - wrong side

wyib - with yarn in back

YO - yarn over
